Dear Friends of FITCI,

What's in a name? In our case, everything.

The Frederick Innovative Technology Center, Inc., a.k.a. FITCI, is anchored in the greater Frederick community; focused on sparking the light of innovation; and dedicated to nourishing technologies that drive humankind forward.

We are also fortunate to be at the center of a passionately dedicated group of people who share a vision of what we can accomplish together. Nearly 90 individuals volunteer their time and talents on a regular basis. They come from varied backgrounds in industry, government, academia and the community to



serve on FITCI's boards and committees, lead programs, share insights and connect personally as advisors and mentors. You can get to know some of them through our video series, *In the Trenches,* via our reimagined website, **www.fitci.org.** Here you'll also find a blog, helpful links and news about FITCI happenings, awards, and clients. This information supplements our dedicated business resource portal for members, also launched in 2018, with the help of FITCI client, Breezio.

Perhaps our most exciting accomplishment this year was the introduction of our second location, ROOT – a tech-focused business resources center in the heart of downtown Frederick. It is beautifully designed for functionality and flexibility. Fully-furnished offices run 88 to 231sq ft, and it also offers training/conference space and co-work options. Best of all, the building houses our partners from Frederick County

Economic Development, the Chamber of Commerce, Hood College and CREST. We are especially grateful to County Executive, Jan Gardner, for her continued support and fierce devotion to strengthening the community through cooperative creativity.

While preparing for our 10th annual Technology Showcase with the Fort Detrick Alliance, it struck me that we've nurtured more than 100 startups since our founding in 2004. Of 80 biotech companies listed on Frederick County's website, 27 are FITCI graduates. In January, client RoosterBio, transitioned from our Metropolitan Court facility to 14,000 sq ft. on nearby Westview Drive. They plan to grow to 50 employees in the next few years. FITCI currently serves 41 emerging companies, a 144% increase in the past 2 years alone. Imagine the potential they represent!

That future comes into focus a little more every day. Whether we are hosting guests, such as our federal representatives, a business delegation from China, or representing FITCI at prestigious events like the RESI conference in Boston, we understand that development of commercially viable businesses in Frederick are strengthened through these interactions.

As we approach FITCI's 15-year anniversary in May, we see the opportunity to attune our efforts even further. We are creating a makerspace/tech shop for social collaboration and establishing a one-of-a-kind 12-week community accelerator program through a grant from the Rural Maryland Council. These initiatives augment a substantial roster of program opportunities – Funded 'N' Brews, Beyond the Pitch, Reality Check and Startup U, among others.

FITCI continues to build momentum. We close the year with gratitude for every success and for every person who stepped up to help them happen.

We look forward to next year and remain committed to our entrepreneurial ecosystem.







A Year in Review

SECOND LOCATION GRAND OPENING

On February 1, 2018, FITCI opened its second Frederick location downtown in the ROOT building. Housed here are all of your business resources under one roof: FITCI, Office of Economic Development, Frederick Chamber of Commerce, CREST, and Hood College.

STARTUP U LAUNCH

StartUp U is a training sequence to ensure the entrepreneurs' business is solid. The training is taught by very successful CEOs and the focus is creating a solid business model, value proposition, and perfect pitch while validating all with customer discovery and pitching to real investors.

IN THE TRENCHES

On August 30, 2018, FITCI unveiled our *In The Trenches* video interview series which features FITCI CEO, Kathie Callahan Brady, talking with our esteemed advisors about the interesting aspects of their business, as well as some of the struggles they encountered as they developed and grew.

FUNDRAISING BOOTCAMP

Dennis Ford, Founder and CEO of Life Science Nation, creator of the RESI Conference Series, and author of *The Life Science Executive's Fundraising Manifesto* presented a fundraising boot camp to our clients at our Metropolitan Court location in August. He spoke about raising capital, the changing investor landscape, debunking the top 10 old myths in fundraising, among other helpful topics.

SLICING THE PIE

August was a busy time for FITCI. Author of the books *Slicing the Pie* and *Perfect Equity Splits for Bootstrapped Startups,* Mike Moyer, came to our ROOT location to speak to our clients about the fair way to share equity in startups.

ROOT has become the go-to location for many meetups in Frederick. We are currently home to Meetup Workshop, Frederick Web Tech, Startup Grind, Frederick.net, the Minority Business Vision Networking Events, as well as FrederickTechByte who launches their **podcasts** from one of the offices on our floor!

P3 EVENT

September found FITCI hosting a Private Preview Party (P3) where we celebrated the most innovative companies launching in Frederick today. This was our inaugural P3 event and featured three of our clients: American Shochu Company, Ductoad, and Goefer.

We launched our new website including a blog and online portal in conjunction with announcing our new Community Manager, Ivana Shuck.

IN THE NEWS

NanoBioFab won first place in the US Eastern Entrepreneurship Contest, hosted by the center for US-China Technology, Innovation, and Development.

GOEFER presented at *The Big Idea CONNECTpreneur Expo* in Washington, DC.

They were 1 of only 9 startup companies invited.

Veralox won a \$319,133 SBIR grant.

The President of Integrated Pharma Services was named "Business Leader of the Year" by Frederick Community College and "Innovator of the Year" by Maryland Women's Business Council.

<u>Daxia</u> received a grant for research and development.

Only 11 companies worldwide won this inaugural grant.

Daxia (who at that time was Decentralized Derivatives Association) was invited to apply only 2 months after they had established the company.

Theradaptive received a Stem Cell Research grant from TEDCO.

They were chosen by an independent scientific peer review committee from a field of 20 other emerging companies.

RURAL MARYLAND GRANTS

FITCI is the recipient of two grants, totaling \$450,000, from the Rural Maryland Prosperity Investment Fund of the Rural Maryland Council (RMC) for fiscal year 2019.

This Fund provides targeted investment to promote economic prosperity in Maryland's rural communities. The first grant, for \$200,000, will be used toward the development of a Community Growth Accelerator Technology Development Program

called *The Edge @ Root* which will complement the services provided in FITCI's two incubator locations. The RMC awarded FITCI \$250,000 for the construction and operation of a premier Tech Shop, a new shared tech makerspace.

MOU SIGNING

A new program launched by FITCI in collaboration with the Frederick National Laboratory for Cancer Research and numerous community partners.

The new Community Growth Accelerator Technology Development Program is aimed at driving startup formation, development, and expansion in Frederick County. Entrepreneurs involved in the program will get access to weekly inperson classes, mentorship from business leaders throughout the community, focus groups, and an online portal housing additional educational resources. In addition to the Frederick National Laboratory for Cancer Research and FITCI, Frederick Chamber

of Commerce: Hood College, the Frederick County Office of Economic Development, and the City of Frederick Department of Economic Development, are also signatories on the memorandum of understanding (MOU) as the founding partners forming the Community Growth Accelerator along with many more community partners. In addition, a grant from the Rural Maryland Council provided funding for the Accelerator.
